BACKGROUND:

With Construction beginning March 17, 2008 on the first of many projects approved by the Board of Education at its February 2, 2008 special workshop meeting, a ceremonial Capital Improvement Program (CIP) / modernization ground breaking date is requested to be scheduled. This event should be discussed and a date and time determined that best fits the Board's schedule, the Gant chart schedule for each school, and community's calendar. A date between March 24 and June 15, 2008 fits within the terms of the Cajon Park construction time frame. Douglas E Barnhart (DEB) has generously volunteered their marketing department to assist us with communicating the event to the public. Also DEB's marketing department is available to assist in anyway with the planning and coordinating of the event to ensure a successful outcome. Additionally, the groundbreaking ceremony will be marketed on the District's website and in the March Independent Citizens Oversight Committee newsletter.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education discuss and determine a date for the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) / modernization groundbreaking ceremony at each school based on the attached Gant chart and Governance Calendar. It is usual protocol that one groundbreaking ceremony be conducted at the beginning of construction, followed by ribbon cutting events at the completion of each individual site project. Ribbon cutting events would be planned at each site once projects are completed in future years. What is the pleasure of the Board?

This recommendation supports the following District goals:

Provide facilities that optimize the learning environment for all students.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact at this time. The budget of the Capital Improvement Program is \$128.7 million for nine (9) school modernizations, and will be funded from CIP funds, Prop R bond proceeds, and State modernization matching funds. A budget of \$500 for each school's ceremony is proposed for ribbons, invitations, et cetera for a total cost of \$2,500.

Discussion of Hill Creek School 10-Classroom Building Addition Site Location

Prepared by Bill Clark February 19, 2008

BACKGROUND:

The Board of Education approved the Hill Creek school project scope of a 10-classroom junior high addition at its February 2, 2008 special workshop meeting. At that time, the Board directed staff to bring back an alternative building location / site plan for the project. Attached for the Board's review and discussion is an alternative site plan / building location for the Hill Creek project. This location will still provide building alignment for day lighting and a better relationship with existing classroom buildings and the library technology building. A decision for this building location is needed so that the modernization plans can show the addition accurately in the plan re-submittal to the Division of State Architect (DSA) for modernization building permits.

The revised proposed location of the 10-classroom addition provides a separation between the existing residential community and the project. The attached site plan maintains playground space along the southern property line as it currently exists adjacent to the residential homes.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education discuss the Hill Creek School 10classroom addition and provide direction to administration of the Board's desire for the building location of this project.

Provide facilities that optimize the learning environment for all students.





Approval to Proceed with Modernization Services

BACKGROUND:

The Division of State Architect (DSA) reviews and approves all school construction projects. Part of the construction process requires construction materials testing labs and Inspectors of Record (IOR) services be assigned to the construction of school projects. These entities must be DSA-qualification approved.

With future construction on the school sites being planned as early as March 2008, the Board of Education authorized the request for qualifications (RFQ) and preparation of an approved and qualified list of DSA-approved materials testing labs that will be needed during the next five years of capital improvement and construction. An advertisement for the RFQ was placed in the San Diego Daily Transcript in addition to being posted on our web site. The RFQ was faxed and e-mailed to all firms that had inquired and requested to be notified in the past nine months. Fifteen (15) firms submitted a response by the advertised deadline.

A qualified list of ten (10) testing labs that are available locally in San Diego has been established. Administration recommends use of the closest labs to reduce travel time costs. Future contracts with qualified and approved materials test labs will be brought forth to the Board from the attached pre-qualified list.

Additionally, on December 4, 2007 the Board of Education approved a list of 10 qualified entities for Inspector of Record (IOR) services. Administration recommends the firms of Hendrix, California School Construction Services; and Maletic, Blue Coast Consulting, LLC to provide these inspection services for the Phase 1 projects at five schools.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve consultant contracts with the firms of Hendrix, California School Construction Services; and Maletic, Blue Coast Consulting, LLC for IOR services. It is also recommended that the Board of Education approve the list of qualified material test labs for materials lab testing services that will be used for the next five years of capital improvement and construction as needed.

This recommendation supports the following District goal:

Provide facilities that optimize the learning environment for all students.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Based on the present capital improvement program financial summary, approximately \$924,096 is budgeted for IOR services and \$1,897,040 is budgeted for materials testing. The budget of the Capital Improvement Program is \$128.7 million for nine (9) school modernizations, and will be funded from CIP funds, Prop R bond proceeds, and State modernization matching funds.

THIS AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL INSPECTION & STAFF EXTENSION SERVICES (the "Agreement") is made and entered into on _______, by and between the SANTEE SCHOOL DISTRICT OF SAN DIEGO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA, hereinafter referred to as "District", and L. L. Hendrix, Hendrix California School Construction Services, hereinafter referred to as "Consultant".

RECITALS:

A. It is the desire of the Governing Board of the District to contract with consultant to furnish professional inspection and staff extension services in connection with the Districts construction program at Cajon Park, Sycamore Canyon, and Rio Seco schools. For purposes of this Agreement, the Projects shall include all miscellaneous work related thereto or reasonably inferable from any of the "Contract Documents" that would reasonably apply to inspection and Staff Extension services.

B. The District desires to retain Consultant upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth in the consultants proposal of February 12, 2008, and the Consultant desires to accept said retention and will agree to perform the services necessary to achieve DSA final approval of inspection and to assist the District and architect with various time and cost changes that may arise during the period of construction for the price specified in the consultants proposal of February 12, 2008.

NOW THEREFORE for mutual and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties hereto, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The term of this Agreement shall be for the duration of the Project or until May 30, 2009, which ever comes sooner. The District anticipates the completion of the Project to occur on or about April 30, 2009, but does not warranty or guarantee that the project will complete by April 30, 2009, and will expect consultant to complete the project services as will be mutually agreed at the time a determination of delay is made.
- 2. The Consultant shall, on behalf of the State of California and the District, furnish all required inspections necessary to complete the Project and perform all miscellaneous related work as assigned by the State of California Division of the State Architect (the "DSA") or the District (collectively, the "Services").
- 3. The Consultant shall provide all reports, certificates, drawings and other items and documentation required by the District, by law or by any of the Contract Documents in connection with the Projects. Certain of such required reports, certificates and drawings are set forth in Title 24 of the California State Building Code. The California Codes Applicable to inspection of public school construction, the consultants February12, 2008 proposal and the Contract Documents are hereby incorporated herein by this reference.

- 4. District will pay consultant by check made payable to L. L. Hendrix within in thirty days of the receipt of an invoice for work completed the previous month or months on the projects defined in the consultants proposal letter of February 12, 2008..
- C. Consultant certifies that all of its employees or sub-consultant employees who may come in contact with pupils have not been convicted of and/or have no criminal charges pending for a felony, as defined in Education Code section 45122.1.
- D. In the event Consultant fails to comply with all of the requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 and injury results from such failure, Consultant shall defend, indemnify. protect and hold the District and its agents, officers and employees harmless from and against any and all claims, demands, liability, judgments, awards, losses, injury, damages, expenses, charges or costs of any kind or character whether to the District or to any person or property which arise from or are connected with or are caused or claimed to be caused by Consultant's failure to comply with the requirements contained in Education Code section 45125.1, including, but not limited to, the requirement prohibiting Consultant from using employees or sub-consultant employees who may have contact with pupils who have been convicted or have charges pending for a felony as defined in Education Code section 45122.1.
- E. Any sub-consultant hired by Consultant shall be subject to and shall comply with this provision. Consultant and sub-consultant shall be jointly and severally liable for any injury that results from sub-consultants' failure to comply with this provision.


